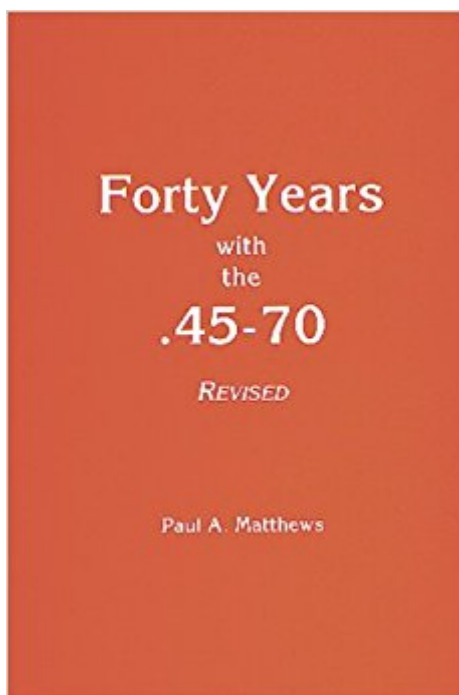

Centered mostly around the Ruger #1 & #3 rifles in .45-70 The author lists his experiences in loading, shooting and hunting with the caliber. Excellent history of his research and what worked and didn't work for him. This book can save a shooter countless hours in working up loads for targets or hunting. He has also written an excellent book on paper-patched bullets entitled "The Paper Jacket"

This book will be of interest pretty much only to guys who shoot the .45-70 Ruger #1 rifle. Matthews

did his own casting and reloading for decades with very little information to go by. He was one of the early guys who figured out how powerful a modern .45-70 could be. This book is his learning that a big soft bullet at moderately low speeds hunts great at shorter ranges, without a ton of recoil. A bit faster gives him an edge when the game is walking quickly, and all the power he'll ever need. Mostly Paul Matthews is famous for his treatise on The Paper Jacket, his work on paper patched soft lead bullets. Both are great, the kind of stories you used to hear from the old guys at the country store or the gun shop if you lived in Mayberry.
