

A Table In The Presence: The Dramatic Account Of How A U.S. Marine Battalion Experienced God's Presence Amidst The Chaos Of The War In Iraq





Synopsis

On April 10th, 2003, the 1st Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment, faced with the task of seizing the presidential palace in downtown Baghdad, ran headlong into what Lieutenant Colonel Oliver North called, "the worst day of fighting for U.S. Marines." Hiding in buildings and mosques, wearing civilian clothes, and spread out for over a mile, Saddam Hussein's militants rained down bullets and rocket propelled grenades on the 1st Battalion. But when the smoke of the eight-hour battle cleared, only one Marine had lost his life. Some said the 1st Battalion was incredibly lucky. But in the hearts and minds of the Marines who were there, there was no question. God had brought them miraculously through that battle. As the 1st Battalion's chaplain, Lieutenant Carey Cash had the unique privilege of seeing firsthand, from the beginning of the war to the end, how God miraculously delivered, and even transformed, the lives of the men of the 1st Battalion. Their regiment, the most highly decorated regiment in the history of the Marines, was the first ground force to cross the border into Iraq, the first to see one of their own killed in battle, and they were the unit to fight what most believe to have been the decisive battle of the war-April 10th in downtown Baghdad. Through it all, Carey Cash says, the presence of God was undeniable. Cash even had the privilege of baptizing fifty-seven new Christians-Marines and Sailors-during the war in Iraq. The men of the 1st Battalion came to discover what King David had discovered long ago--that God's presence could be richly experienced even in the presence of enemies. AUTHOR: Lieutenant Carey H. Cash, Chaplain, United States Navy, is a battalion chaplain to infantry Marines based at Camp Pendleton, California. In Operation Iraqi Freedom, his unit was the first ground combat element to cross the border into Iraq. He is a graduate of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and was commissioned as a chaplain in 1999. Carey and his wife, Charity, have five children, and live in Southern California.

As a Freshman in college I was but a young child when the 9/11 attacks assaulted United States Soil. Therefore for a majority of my life our country has been at war. Because of this, I have only seen the Middle East, its people and the war as terrible and barbaric. This is why I greatly appreciate how Cash focused on Christ and emphasized on how Our Lord loves people of all ages, races, genders and religion. This book helped soften my heart towards the war and the people. This book is a fantastic reminder that we as Christians must love and respect every person we meet, even if that person has different beliefs than we do. The other aspect that touched me was all the times God appeared and performed many miracles. As a person young in my walk with Christ, I find myself doubting and questioning my walk and my Lord at times. Reading about the moments God worked miracles for the men eased my worries and doubts. I would recommend this book to anyone who is doubting that the Lord is at work in the world today. It is easy to see the Lord's hand on every page of the narrative, whether it is keeping the men alive in extremely dangerous situations, or through the way the men's hearts changed and turned toward God. If it can settle my doubts, it will settle others.

A Table in the Presence by Carey Cash is an autobiography of his time as a Marine Chaplain during the invasion of Iraq. It is a story starting from the days leading to the invasion. Beginning in Kuwait following the journey from desert warzone into the battles of bloody neighborhood streets Baghdad. Cash describes that God protects the righteous and just from their enemies yet God does not look down on people of other religions. Cash has to help soldiers be able to cope with deaths of friends and comrades such as team leaders. More importantly he is able to aid the soldiers in his unit in finding their faith during wartime by providing them with the view that it is their duty to fight and God is all right with it. This is a great book for anyone that is struggling to find his or her faith

especially military members trying to find where they stand on God and religion during wartime. It is great for that reason because it has viewpoints and examples about faith from various viewpoints during the expedition from Kuwait to Baghdad.

I read this book before I deployed to Iraq as a Navy chaplain in 2005. While it "freaked me out" a bit at that time, it prepared me well for ministry to Marines. Chaplain Cash's unapologetic approach to God's protection was difficult to reconcile when, for whatever reason, some don't seem to be as protected. However, he does not shy away from this dilemma toward the end of the book. He readily admits his own theological questions regarding this, but also speaks of God's comfort in the midst of confusion and pain. 10 years later: I am honored to be serving with him at the Naval Academy. Without a doubt, he is the real deal. This book receives my highest recommendation, particularly for those who are interested in military ministry.

I was greatly moved by this account of American Marines, and their faith in Jesus Christ. God miraculously protected hundreds of His faithful followers in the midst of fiery battles, and we have His promise to do the same for you and I as well as all who love and serve Him. If He has called you, He also has a place of service only you can fill. He will cover you with His protection until your job is done. Never fear!
