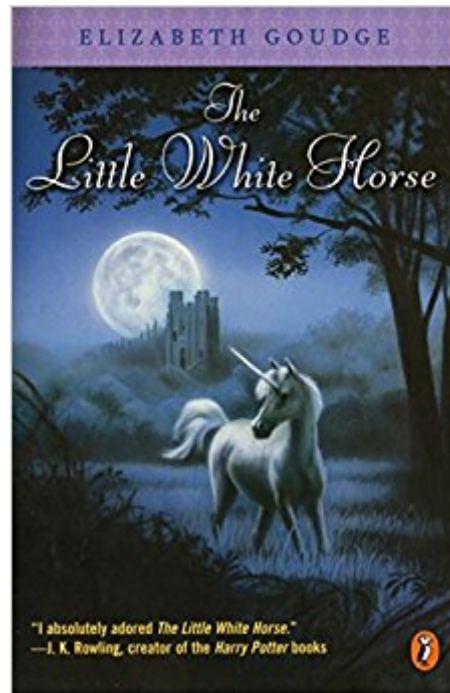

much, but I just adore all the loving detail and reading this book is like enjoying traditional afternoon tea in a spring garden in full bloom, complete with friends and easy cheerful conversation. thank you so much for this glimpse back into my childhood!also, the movie partly based on this book, (and aptly renamed *The Secret of Moonacre*) is also a dreamy lovely thing! the plot has been altered somewhat, but it doesn't ruin anything, especially since they didn't take the original name of the book. why doesn't this happen anymore in modern cinema!! it would make everything so much easier, and help loving fans see it as a different version of their favorite characters and keep it separate from the book!

I first found the book in the library when I was 10, and was enchanted. I have bought this book for other girls, as I think it is a wonderful book, filled with adventure, whimsy, romance, and good writing. Juliet Stevenson is an excellent reader, and with that combination, I decided to spring for the audiobook. Nowhere on the site does it say that it is abridged, but it is. I avoid abridged books wherever I can, so when I got the CD (2 CD's) I was unpleasantly surprised. A classic like this should be read in full. I like the author's version so much better. That is why I took away one star, and for no other reason.

I read this book based on J.K. Rowling's statement that it was her favorite book as a child, and it's easy to see why she loved it. I wish I had known of it when I was a child. An allegory, a fairy tale and a morality play all rolled into one, this delightful story should entertain adult readers and enchant the younger set, though it may be too very sweet for older kids.As Goudge's *The Little White Horse* opens, Maria Merryweather is travelling toward her destiny, though she does not yet know this. Suddenly an impoverished orphan, she is travelling to Moonacre Manor, the home of a mysterious relative, in the company of her caretaker Miss Heliotrope and her little dog Wiggins. The story of Maria's adventures is fanciful and charming and populated by magical characters living in an enchanted place. Maria learns that people and stories are usually more than first impressions suggest, that even virtuous people have faults and even wicked people have goodness, that one can learn from previous mistakes ?- one?s own and others? ?- and make a better decision next time. All problems are resolved at the end, all loose ends tied neatly. First published in 1946, the voice here hints at modern narrative awareness of itself, but is never cynical.A drawing of Moonacre Manor is here, and chapters are short enough to make this a great read-aloud novel.

"The Little White Horse" is a fantasy novel for pre-teens and adults by the always surprising

Elizabeth Goudge. Originally published by the University of London Press in 1946, with glorious illustrations by C. Walter Hodges, it is the enchanting story of second chances not only for 13 year-old orphan, Maria Merryweather, who is every bit as spirited as Anne of Green Gables fame, but also Miss Heliotrope and other adults who have lost the love of their lives through personal faults and family vendettas. This edition does not have Hodges's illustrations, but it retains the enchanting plot and wholly original characters like Marmaduke Scarlet, Wiggins, and Loveday Minette. NOTE: I was searching for a horse story as a birthday present for my daughter who adores all things horses. The little white horse has a very small, but pivotal role in the plot--unlike other classic and beloved horse stories like Walter Farley's "Black Stallion" or "Misty of Chincoteague" by Marguerite Henry. Pair with the delightful movie, "Secret of Moonacre".

When I read this book the first time, I was a little lost, cause it's a lot about belief, and I'm not really a believer. But what really is interesting in this book is the values it relays. The courage, the wish to overpass the errors of the past, the friendship, the importance of not hurting other people and the wish to believe in a better world and work for it to happen. All the characters are endearing and there are lots of mysteries in this story. I read it several times and I think it's good to read it twice to see all the implications and to better understand each of the characters. There's also a lot of action in this book, dangers and strange creatures as well as humans that have gone through a dangerous path and couldn't come back...

I got this because it was a favorite of J.K. Rowling-I had read it many years ago but thought it worth another look. It did not disappoint at all!
