

I have this book in both hard cover and kindle version. I have read these books ever since I was a young girl.

Another great book for young adults in the "Meet the Austins" series of Madeline L'Engle.

Unlike in the Time quintet, the evil in this book is human... There is, of course, the evil that is the thing that a human has done. But there is also the evil that is the relational mess and emotional turmoil that goes on and must be resolved. This is a beautifully written and beautifully created story that will draw you into its life to experience the emotion and the resolution fully. The heroine is a young blind girl; and as a female who is blind, I must say that I am most impressed with the character development. Emily is not portrayed as a person with some kind of superhuman ability that develops in spite of her lack of sight; nor is she portrayed in any way as someone who has something to overcome that has to do with blindness itself. Her blindness is a personal characteristic that is sometimes irritating to her and causes her frustration at times; but she also is skilled at coping with it in her daily life, and when presented with the opportunity to take advantage of it in order to solve the community dilemma, she does so. Emily's true struggle is in other areas of life; and this is the genius that is L'Engle's work in developing her character. She is a child struggling to find her identity; and she is acutely aware of the relational and emotional issues affecting the family with whom she lives. The depth of her friendship with Vicky is truly touching. As deeply touching is the impact of that friendship on Susy--and while I was never personally drawn to Susy, I found myself empathizing with her at times while reading this book. I had difficulty deciding whether I identified more with Emily or Vicky. (It is still a toss-up.)

Fun and entertaining and with some theology and ethics thrown in. Adults m, young adults and some children could all enjoy this in different ways

When you think about when her books were written you see that she wrote about things like lasers long before sci-fi was common and the concepts understood by the masses. Her characters are so alive - even the villains have referencing qualities and her heroes are far from perfect. I read this book as a girl and then as an adult and enjoyed it both times in different ways.

Her books are always a good and thoughtful read in which I always learn something. She tells a

good story, and I've really enjoyed following the Austin family.

While this is a continuation of the Austin Family series, this book has more of a sense of menace than the others. As always, L'Engle brings important ideas into her stories - there's a lot to talk about.

I love her writing, and I enjoy reading about the Austin family. I read her as a teen and now I read her as an older adult!
