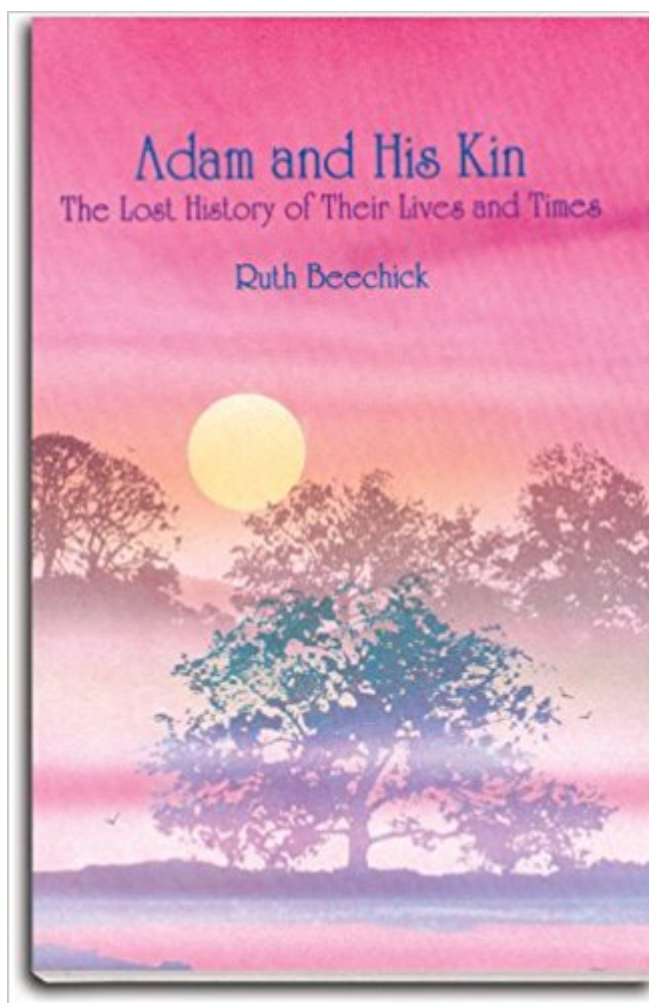

Dr. Ruth Beechick is author or editor of more than 100 manuals, workbooks and other items for Bible learning, as well as several books on education topics. She is a former teacher and professor of education, and is known for her talent in making complex topics clear and understandable. "Adam and His Kin" continues in that tradition.

The book itself was pretty good. It fit seamlessly with our history lessons thru Veritas Press. Some parts were mundane and unnecessary to the story, so I skipped over those, but it offered great imagery. The book was advertised as Used - Very Good but it wasn't as "good" as I expected it to be. There was a large stain on the back cover, and there were pencil scribbles inside.

This book was initially assigned to my son as assigned reading in his Mystery of History I class

because the author of MOH highly recommended it. However, the teacher failed to read it before assigning it. We ordered it and read the first few chapters. After that, I contacted his teacher to ask why she'd recommend this book. This is far from an imaginative approach to the subject matter. That might be useful. This is a deliberate corrupting of the subject matter. I don't know Beechick's background but I do wonder why she would write a book that would deliberately confuse and mislead readers. She introduces inappropriate stories and false doctrine in the guise of fleshing out the story. Either the author of Mystery of History has never read the book herself or she is fine with this truly awful approach. That concerns me as well. I honestly can't understand how anyone who is a Christian could recommend this book.

Fascinating! Adam and Noah seem so far removed from us that we often don't think of them as real people. Beechick creates a bit of a storyline around them that goes along with the Bible and with what we know from history. It gave me a new understanding of this part of Genesis. Thanks.
