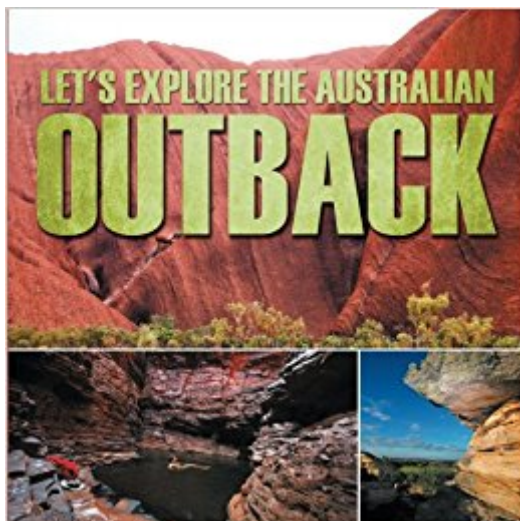

Very high quality pictures, some of them will just take your breath away. After looking and reading this book about Australia, people of all ages will probably want to go on a trip there. These camels were used to build railroads. The camels were then abandoned after they were done using them. That sounds so sad. In the Australia Outback book, there was a cool picture of a cave like dwelling, called a Dugout, that people actually live in! In the town of Coober Pedy, people living there do that to stay out of the "Scorching Heat". I didn't know, until I read this book, that the Outback takes up the most area in Australia. I also learned that in the Outback, that there are plenty of flat lands, as well as rock formations, and at least one mountain range. To me it looks like mostly dry plains. That kind of surprised me, I thought Australia was greener than that. The book, Let's Explore The Australian Outback is interesting, educational and fun. This a very short book with a number of pictures of places in the Outback. Some of the descriptions could definitely be more interesting. Coober Pedy is not just a place where people built underground places to live. It is and was the opal mining center of Australia. You can visit opal mines and spend the night underground in one of these places. I did this on a trip to the Outback in 2009. I

am really glad I had also included a trip to an animal preserve near Sydney because I would never have seen a "live" kangaroo otherwise. For two days we drove from Alice Springs to Adelaide passing a car or truck coming from the opposite direction about every 45 minutes. Along the side of the road were a number of dead kangaroos. With a great amount of time between cars/trucks passing on the road they had to be very slow or just unlucky, I guess. The pictures of the Flinders Mountains look about as I saw them. A famous concert was held there on two separate occasions. During the Australian Bi-centennial in 1988 there was "Opera in the Outback" which was a great achievement when you consider about a dozen people actually live where it was staged. All of the passenger train cars in Australia were brought to that area full of concert goers to see and hear Dame Kiri Te Kanawa. There were also horse races the next day. Thousands of people arrived on the train and by camper/caravan. This was repeated in 1997 and recorded. This performance with some beautiful scenery of the area is available on as Opera in the Outback. It is not entirely opera. This is an ok book to show kids some pictures of the Outback but does not really give you information worth having and does not show any of the experience of being there.....like the huge flies in your face!
