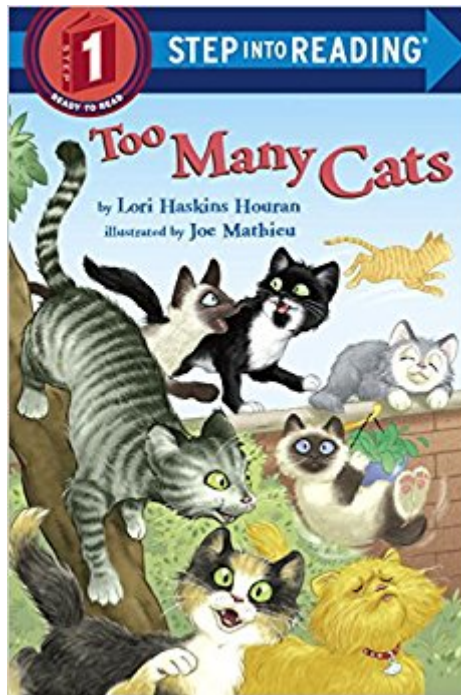

As the text progresses, the cats hurry to a meeting place: "All these cats, they like one thing. / All these cats, they like to . . . With a turn of the page, emergent readers will be rewarded with having predicted the next word: "Sing. The vibrant illustrations have a coloring-book feel, but the cats are nevertheless adorable. Full of energy, the pictures add touches of conflict, like when the white cat stands in front of a freshly painted fence and becomes a green cat. A cellist practicing on a balcony has to compete with the yowling cats, but much to the musician's
