

Since I got sucked into The Change series starting with Dies the Fire, I feel kinda stuck with seeing it all play out to the end. The universe of the change is interesting, but all the themes have been touched on before so in most ways, this is just more of the same. More food porn, more swords and edged weapon battle porn, more evil while on the good side we've just moved on to the next generation of children. I hate to say it, but it seems like Steve has a contract for 'x' number of books and he's playing them out. He's a great writer and the premise of this universe is well thought out. His research impeccable. His writing is typically Stirling with excellent descriptive language, lovable characters on the side of good and true evil characters on the dark side with a few lovable rogues thrown in along the way. Predictable, but necessary for completeness. I wonder how many more of these he will write before he decides he's played this universe out?

By far. How long to the next one? I really like these books. This series is one of the best I've read. Love the many threads each has and how well each carries forward. One thread starting off too war, another at the beginning of another. In the violent history of the world after a calamity that has fallen the basis of its civilization away. Recommended.

He is unsure of himself, pushed around by strong women and very gradually growing up. There is a tangible humanity there I found really appealing. I also thought changing the locale of the stories to the south

seas made the book much more interesting. The remnants of Australia were full of funky three dimensional people who in some ways were more interesting than those back in good ole Montival. I eagerly look forward to the next book.

If you haven't read this series you must! I can't wait for each new novel and love how he's developed the characters as well as the story.
